On their return the Chair announced their decision. In reaching the decision members took into account the relevant written and verbal representations.

RESOLVED that the application be granted for a premises licence as applied for but as amended at the hearing.

The Clerk to the Sub-Committee advised the applicant and the local resident that he would confirm the decision in writing and reminded them of their right to appeal.
