4.	QUESTIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONSTITUTION	CC36 – 2015
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Question to the Leader from County Councillor Gareth Ratcliffe

Following comments on Social Media in which an Elected Member of Powys County Council, alleges that the CEO has a plasma TV installed in his office, complete with a satellite TV package, could the Leader please make a statement on this matter, and in doing so answer the following questions :-

- a) Does the CEO have a TV set in his office and what is its precise purpose or use?**
- b) Are there any satellite packages available on this set?**

Thank you for your question. I have spoken to the Chief Executive who has confirmed that there is a television in his office which is used as a multi-media facility. It is not a plasma television.

The Chief Executive has also confirmed that the television receives “free air” television channels via Freesat.

The Chief Executive has kindly agreed to brief the Council meeting on the purpose and use of the multi-media facility.

The Leader sought advice from the Monitoring Officer who confirmed that it was in order for the Chief Executive to brief the Council. The Chief Executive confirmed that the TV in his office was not a plasma and did not have a Sky TV package but a Freesat package. He advised that as a category one responder for emergency planning he needed access to news channels. He also advised that the TV was used as a multi-media centre for presentations and for video conferencing through Lync. A primary consideration was the need to reduce the amount of time spent travelling as this assisted him in coping with his disability.

There was no supplementary question.

Question to the Leader from County Councillor Gwilym Williams

At the last Full Council meeting I asked the leader how many consultants were employed by Powys and how much they cost, this was provided by the leader.

My supplementary question was how many agencies, are employed by Powys and how much they cost, this information was promised by the leader that it would be sent to me, after several requests to date the date of this letter [8th April, 2015] I have not received a response.

Therefore I would like to ask my supplementary question from the previous full Council. How many agencies are employed and how much they cost Powys County Council?

Below is a breakdown of costs incurred through the engagement of agency staff employed for the financial year 2014/15

As agency staff are not directly employed by the Council, it does not have a statutory responsibility to report on the number of agency staff engaged as it needs to for staff who it directly employs and pays via the payroll system. Furthermore, the responsibility for the engagement of agency staff is devolved to the service area and there is consequently no central record of numbers of agency staff engaged that can be easily interrogated. The information requested may only be established through a detailed review of invoices relating to agency expenditure. This work is underway and I will endeavour to provide a verbal update at the Council meeting.

Councillor Williams asked as his supplementary question whether the Leader was able to verbally update Council. The Leader apologised for the length of time it had taken to compile the information in the answer. He would circulate further information to Members by email.

Question to the Leader from County Councillor Gwilym Williams

With regard to the information provided by the leader of the last full Council meeting regarding consultants, can he tell me how many of these consultants that you provided information for are employed by Powys County Council for more than one year?

The spreadsheet supplied at the last Council meeting has been updated with a note on the duration of each contract and is appended. (Copy filed with the signed minutes).

The Council does not have open ended contracts for the supply of consultancy as they tend to relate to support for discreet time-bound projects and we don't employ consultants / consultancies to fulfil established roles in the Council.

Councillor Williams' supplementary question was how long would a consultant have to be employed before it would be cheaper for the Council to employ its own staff? The Leader said that he would circulate a response to Members.

The Leader and Chief Executive left the meeting to attend a meeting with Welsh Government Ministers.

7.	CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S BRIEFING	CC42 – 2015
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The Strategic Director People gave the briefing on the Chief Executive's behalf. She advised that the General Election counts would be held in the Pavilion in Llandrindod Wells and the Flash Leisure Centre in Welshpool. Preparations were underway for the Council's participation at the Royal Welsh Show and the National Eisteddfod which would promote the County as a leisure destination and the recruitment of foster carers. The Strategic Director advised that a partnership with businesses and Ceredigion called Growing Mid Wales was being developed. She also informed Members that bids had been shortlisted for Leisure Services and it was hoped to announce the operator in early May. Finally, she reminded Members about the joint

seminar with Powys teaching Health Board on Wednesday 29th April which would outline progress towards integration.

8.	DRAFT ONE POWYS PLAN UPDATE 2015	CC43 – 2015
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Council considered an update to the One Powys Plan. A correction was required on page 20 where the heading should be Highways. Officers were asked to increase the size of the print on page 7.

County Councillor Alexander queried whether the measure relating to the percentage of year 11 leavers not in education, employment or training would be less than 3% was sufficiently challenging given that the baseline figure in 2012/13 was 2.6%. The Portfolio Holder for Education who was not present would be asked to look at the point raised by Councillor Alexander and to reply to her, copying the response to all Members. 9.	RESPONSE TO WELSH GOVERNMENT WHITE PAPER REFORMING LOCAL GOVERNMENT: POWER TO LOCAL PEOPLE	CC44 – 2015
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Council considered a response to the Welsh Government Paper Reforming Local Government: Power to Local People.

Council considered and agreed the following amendments to the draft response circulated with the agenda.

Chapter 2 - Balancing the responsibilities of National and Local Government

Add an additional bullet point under comments:

A 3rd statutory duty for economic development should be placed on National Park Authorities.

County Councillor Geraint Hopkins declared an interest as Chair of the Brecon Beacons National Park Authority and abstained from voting.

Chapter 3 Renewing democracy

Amend bullet point 3 to read:

Leaders should have regard to the desirability of diversity in appointing their Cabinet, especially in respect of the Welsh language; however, Leaders' freedom to appoint according to criteria of competence and experience should not be fettered.

Amend comment, bullet point 4 to read

Reduction in number of councillors in line with UK average is supported in principle. However, the need to safeguard the accessibility of democracy suggests that in rural areas population size needs to be balanced against geographical size. Due respect should be paid to distinct community boundaries.

New bullet point relating to paragraph 3.5 'diversity among Councillors:

Diversity among Councillors is best served by ensuring it is as easy as possible for people of all backgrounds and circumstances to stand as Councillors. This should be addressed by remuneration, childcare allowances and terms of service. It is then for the electorate to decide whom they wish to represent them; and no steps should be taken to direct, undermine or limit that essential democratic freedom.

Chapters 4 & 5 - Connecting with Communities and Empowerment

Strengthen the response relating to the challenges faced by small rural Community Councils.

Amend bullet point dealing with dual membership of County and Town and Community Council to read:

Serving members of Local Authorities SHOULD be able to become a member on a Community Council and continue their position in the Local Authority.

Add an additional bullet point:

Aspirations for diversity should be appropriately resourced.

Chapter 8 - Strengthening the Role of Review

Add an additional bullet point: Further Welsh Government resources should be made available for regional scrutiny.

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Question to the Portfolio Holder for Social Care from County Councillor Graham Jones

I would like to ask Mr Darren Mayor, Portfolio Holder for Social Care, to explain to me in detail how Powys get to the figure of £189,000 per year to run Llanidloes Day Centre.

The £189,000 was a position statement, however, the current forecast for outturn for the day centre is £195,454.97 for 2014/15.

The detail below includes a detailed account of all costs which are attributed to the Llanidloes day centre for the financial year 2014/15.

The final outturn figure will be available on 15th May 2015.

In response to Councillor Jones' supplementary question on what the costs were for consultants and officers working on the handover of the day centre the Portfolio Holder agreed to provide details of the costs.

Question to the Portfolio Holder for Social Care from County Councillor Aled Davies

Can the Portfolio holder for Adult Social Care give a complete and frank explanation for the failure of yet another home care contract?

Alpha/Bryce Care

The decision to terminate the contract with Alpha/Bryce Care at midnight Tuesday 7 April 2015, was taken after serious concerns were raised regarding their financial viability and the impact on the safeguarding of service users, should the company cease to trade without prior being notice given to PCC.

The overall viability of the company was thoroughly risk assessed and the decision to proactively manage the situation and transfer the service in-house, was taken after all attempts had been made to help Alpha/Bryce Care resolve their financial issues.

The decision was based on the following key areas.

Financial Viability

- The company had on several occasions required and had been given a cash advance from PCC for work undertaken, to meet their payroll commitments.
- Alpha had accrued substantial debts including debts owed to HMRC and to other sub-contractors and thereby increasing the risk of the sub-contractors viability.
- Company accounts clearly indicated that they would have difficulty in repaying these debts.
- One of the sub contracted providers had issued a statutory demand, as a result of the non-payment of a large debt, and the institution of insolvency proceedings were suspended for 3 weeks when Alpha/Bryce Care paid an £initial payment. The 3 week deadline was approaching, with no indication that the balance would be fully paid. Hence the need for PCC to proactively manage the situation.
- Serious concern at the overall financial management of Alpha Care following the financial audit that PCC undertook.

Quality Assurance/Safeguarding

- An inspection report from CSSIW highlighted a number of concerns with the company in particular the number of missed calls
- Agency have failed to report missed calls to the council via the agreed missed call reporting procedure
- Concern at how accurate rotas would be maintained to show the shifts planned and delivered and any changes required (eg to cover sickness, leave etc).

Contingency Planning

- A Contingency Plan was already in place but this was revised and reviewed in light of the company's financial position.
- The Plan was subject to a rigorous assessment both internally and CSSIW, who were satisfied with the contingency planning arrangements.
- A Communication Action Plan formed part of the Contingency Plan.
- A Contingency Planning team consisting of senior managers and support staff was put in place, to manage and coordinate the transition.
- Notice was served at 1.00 p.m. on Tuesday 7 April and took effect from midnight on the same day.
- On the afternoon of 7 April the plan was put into effect:
 1. Service users and Alpha/Bryce staff were simultaneously contacted to inform them of developments.

2. *Alpha/Bryce staff were informed that they would transfer across to PCC and to continue to work as normal. More than 90% of the workforce transferred to provide services direct for the Council.*
3. *That evening and the following morning service users were called to ensure they had received a service the previous day. They were again called the following day to ensure that the service had been delivered.*
4. *4 missed calls over the weekend were identified and they were subsequently provided with a replacement worker.*
5. *PCC had rostering information previously supplied by Alpha/Bryce Care and as a result any identified gaps in the worker to service use roster, were picked up by PCC re-ablement team or by other domiciliary care providers.*
6. *PCC, Swansea and NPT were in daily contact and were able as a result, to manage any cross boundary workforce issues.*
7. *Alpha/Bryce staff attended 3 drop in centres across the county, where they were given a briefing on the situation. They were issued with protective clothing, PCC handbook, timesheets etc. and as result of these sessions, PCC was able to gather more information on individual rosters.*
8. *The contingency team are developing 4 week rosters for all transferred staff.*

Swansea and NPT

- *Daily conference calls have been in place for over 2 weeks, as a result of the concerns all 3 councils had over Alpha/Bryce care on issues of safeguarding and financial viability.*
- *NPT withdrew their individual service contracts on 1 April based on their financial viability assessment and not as a result of any actions that PCC had taken, PCC did not terminate until 7 April).*
- *Swansea withdrew their individual service contracts on 8/9 April.*
- *The partnership working arrangements have proved to be invaluable and has enabled potential cross boundary risks to be mitigated.*

The Portfolio Holder agreed to provide a response to Councillor Davies' supplementary question on the financial consequences for the service as a result of the breakdown of the contract.

Question to the Portfolio Holder for Social Care from County Councillor Gareth Morgan

Can the Portfolio Holder indicate whether he is still intent on closing the Llanidloes Day Centre at Maes y Wennol by withdrawing County Council funding, if so can he state the date of closure? If he has any alternative plans to keep it open with external support could he describe precisely what they are and with whom they are being discussed and negotiated, and how far advanced his negotiations have reached?

Powys County Council resolved to disinvest from the direct delivery of Older Peoples Day Centres and work in partnership with the third sector and Community Councils in order to find alternative delivery mechanisms. The Council wishes to identify alternative service providers for the following day centres; Ystradgynlais, Brecon, Crickhowell, Llandrindod, Llanidloes, Newtown, Welshpool. This decision has not been changed.

I can confirm that the Day Centre at Llanidloes will continue to run in its current form in the 2015/16 financial year. Council officers are looking to commence work in the Llanidloes area during 2016, with alternative arrangements being put in place by the end of the 2016/17 financial year.

If a local group were to come forward with an interest in running Llanidloes Day Centre, then we would be very happy to meet with them and consider a revenue grant. No discussions have commenced in this area to date.

In response to Councillor Morgan's supplementary question about the level of contribution that the Council would make to any group wishing to take on the running of the centre, the Portfolio Holder advised that in total £500,000 was available to assist in the reconfiguration of day centre services.

County Councillor Mayor left the meeting.

11.	POWYS LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN – DEPOSIT PLAN AND ASSESSMENT REPORTS	CC45 – 2015
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Council considered the Powys Local Development Plan deposit plan and assessment reports. The Portfolio Holder for Regeneration thanked the previous Portfolio Holders, members of the LDP Working Group and the Professional Lead Planning Policy and his team for their work, including the consideration and development of the LDP supporting evidence base that had been used to inform the deposit plan. She advised that if approved, a 6 week consultation period would begin in June and she gave an assurance that all comments received during that period would be considered promptly. It was anticipated that the LDP would be submitted to

the National Assembly in December 2015 and adopted in December 2016. The UDP would expire at the end of June 2016 and from then until the LDP was adopted the Council would be reliant on material planning considerations including past precedents, existing policies contained within the UDP and any new evidence based Policies contained in the emerging LDP. The Council would therefore be in a strong position to defend subsequent Planning decisions whilst the LDP is being adopted.

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Question to the Portfolio Holder for HR from County Councillor H. Williams.

How many apprentices and graduate trainees are currently employed by the County Council?

We have reached the target set for this year with 16 young people following apprenticeship frameworks in the following area Highways (3), Business Administration/ICT (3), Graphic Design (1) and Child Care/Learning Support (9).

Currently Planning are looking at recruiting an Apprentice Technician; Facilities Management are looking to recruit 2 trade apprentices and Resources are hoping to recruit 3.

The Powys Youth Academy is also working with Alun Griffiths Contractors to recruit apprentices locally (2 Civil Engineers, Plant Mechanics, Ground Workers, Plant Operators) for the Newtown bypass project and to establish a National Skills Academy for the length of the project. This will enable the company to employ a development officer to promote Construction/Engineering across schools in the authority. There will also be work experience opportunities made available.

Discussions are also taking place about the possibility of developing a shared apprenticeship scheme. The scheme operates much like the Modern Apprenticeship scheme in that it offers a young person the opportunity to undertake training at either NVQ Level 2 or 3 under a range of Construction Industry recognised framework and where two or more employers would share an apprentice.

The key benefits to this are:

- *Allows smaller employers the opportunity to provide an apprenticeship which in the past they may not have been able to due to the requirements of the framework delivery.*
- *It gives a young person an experience with a range of employers.*
- *It encourages employers to work together as they have to agree a shared job description and salary.*

This concept has previously been delivered in Carmarthenshire very successfully and it is hoped that there will be opportunities for rolling it out further across Powys involving contractors who have been awarded large contracts by the Authority.

As far as the Powys Youth Academy is aware, there is currently only one graduate employed within the Authority in the Communications team. However, 7 were employed under the Go Wales scheme recently within Tourism (3), Trading Standards (2), Change & Governance and Business Support. (A Go Wales Work Placement is a Welsh Government funded project which offers employers the opportunity to employ someone with a degree (or studying for a degree) to complete a specific project while working for them for between 6 and 10 weeks. The employer is able to claim a proportion of the salary paid to the individual during the course of the placement).

In answer to Councillor Williams' supplementary question, the Portfolio Holder confirmed that he had asked the HR section to allocate a named person to deal with apprenticeships in the Council. He referred to the announcement made by Welsh Government of £146m being made available for apprenticeships in Wales but none of which was earmarked for Powys. He would be raising this with the County's AMs. He also advised that he wanted apprentices who had completed their 3 years to be considered for vacant positions.

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16.	QUESTIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONSTITUTION	CC50 – 2015
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Question to the Portfolio Holder for Environment and Sustainability from Councillor G.M. Jones

The Deputy Minister for Culture, Sport and Tourism recently outlined the importance of Tourism to Mid –Wales stating that Tourism is the number one industry in Wales. Wales Rally GB have won the Best Large Event Tourism Award, generating over £10 million into the Welsh economy.

All Powys County Councillors have some kind of Tourism in their ward.

In Powys Rally cars are built, motorcycles are sold, businesses supply parts to the industry etc and Motorsport events are run by volunteers which generates business for Hotels and B&B in the area.

There has been for many years concerns from Motorsport organisations. Such have been these concerns that complaints have been directly addressed with Edwina Hart, Minister for Economy, Science and Transport. Organising events can be, and are becoming a nightmare for clubs.

It is also widely known that the Minister has written scathing letters to Powys County Council on more than one occasion expressing grave concerns that Council's approach could put Powys at an economic disadvantage on this very important issue of Tourism.

The Minister has indicated that she has received no complaints from any other Councils relating to this matter.

My question would be to the Portfolio Holder of the Rights of Way.

While these concerns are known to people in Motorsport, when are all of Powys County Councillors going to be briefed on these concerns of Edwina Hart as it appears that Section 33 Licences are issued by other Councils by the highways Department, but in Powys, in recent years it's been by Rights of Way Department. Therefore what is going to be done regarding the concerns of the Minister to safeguard the future of Motorsport and Tourism and wellbeing of businesses in Powys?

The Cabinet and Leader are of course very supportive of the organised motorsport in Powys.

I and other Cabinet members have met with organisers and been shown best practice recently. In granting section 33 authorisations, you will of course be aware that the County Council must ensure that it complies with other legislation. In particular, it is imperative that the Council ensures that public rights of way are protected, to safeguard the public who may use them and that any damage to their surfaces are repaired.

Further, the authority has a role in protecting any Sites of Special Scientific Interest that are affected by a motor sport application, which requires the organisers to consult with the Natural Resources Wales, and also requires the Council to do so. Regrettably, despite the application form asking for evidence of pre-application consultation with the NRW, this rarely is provided meaning that consultation may have to be rushed and information sought hastily.

It is of note to see that Ceredigion County Council have recently adopted this authority's approach to seeking assurances from organisers that statutory wildlife sites are protected, and they now directly consult with NRW too.

In seeking authorisation from the Council, applicants must also legally provide evidence of landowner consents. Unfortunately, it is all too common that applicants do not supply landowner consents, nor consult with the NRW to ensure SSSIs or other protected sites and species are protected. Receiving an application with only days to go before an event is due to occur is also not uncommon. I am fully aware that in seeking to comply with the law, that this can mean delays.

As for where the applications process should fall, since the processing relates to environmental matters such as safeguarding public rights of way and protected habitats and species, this matter was transferred to the Rights of Way Service some while ago. Since it does not impact upon management of public roads, there is no reason to change the management arrangements.

I have instructed Legal Services to further seek independent advice on some of the issues, to see how we may streamline the processes involved, if we can, and to further clarify points of finer legal detail.

Once this matter has been concluded, I intend to further instruct officers to write to all known motor sport organisers with updated guidance on the key issues. I also intend to make it clear on the application form what is expected of applicants in a tick-box style, and that applications will only be processed if all information is received upfront with the application.

In response to Councillor Jones' supplementary question on whether all Councillors could be briefed on this issue and have sight of correspondence from the Minister, the Portfolio Holder agreed that the issue needed to be resolved and he advised that independent legal advice had been sought.

Question to the Portfolio Holder for Social Care from County Councillor Gary Price

Given that Powys County Council has now terminated the contracts of two of the four providers for home care services can the leader please answer the following questions:

1. **How much did Powys County Council pay for the services of the company (Smart Sourcing PLC) to undertake the commissioning work for the home care services?**
2. **Did Powys County Council financially support Alpha Home Care prior to terminating its contract?**
3. **How much did Powys County Council financially support Alpha Home Care, and has and repayment been made?**
 1. *Between 1st September 2010 and 1st June 2014 (when the contractor finished working for the Council), Smart Sourcing were paid £136,735 in relation to their work completed on the Domiciliary Care tender*
 2. *Powys County Council provided financial support to Alpha Care with a cash advance to assist their cash flow position in August 2014 in order to protect service delivery and ensure the payment of employees' wages.*
 3. *The cash advance in August 2014 was in the sum of £50,000 and was authorised by officers in the service as an operational decision. This sum has been recovered in a recent payment.*

Ar hyn o bryd, mae'r Adran Gynllunio yn ystyried recriwtio Prentis Dechnegydd; mae Rheoli Cyfleusterau eisiau recriwtio 2 brentis masnach ac mae Adnoddau yn gobeithio recriwtio 3.

Mae Academi Ieuencid Powys hefyd yn gweithio gydag Alun Griffiths Contractors i recriwtio prentisiaid yn lleol (2 Beiriannydd Sifil, Peirianwyr Peiriannau, Gweithwyr Tir, Gweithredwyr Peiriannau) ar gyfer prosiect ffordd osgoi'r Drenewydd a sefydlu Academi Sgiliau Cenedlaethol ar gyfer oes y prosiect. Yn ddiweddar, amlinellodd y Dirprwy Weinidog Diwylliant, Chwaraeon a Thwristiaeth bwysigrwydd Twristiaeth i Ganolbarth Cymru, gan ddweud mai Twristiaeth yw'r diwydiant blaenaf yng Nghymru. Mae Rali GB Cymru wdi ennill Gwobr Twristiaeth Digwyddiad Mawr Gorau, gan gynhyrchu mwy na £10 miliwn i'r economi yng Nghymru.

Mae gan holl Gynghorwyr Sirol Powys ryw fath o Dwristiaeth yn eu ward.

Caiff ceir rali eu hadeiladu ym Mhowys, gwerthir beiciau modur, mae busnesau yn cyflenwi darnau i'r diwydiant ac ati, ac mae digwyddiadau modurol yn cael eu rhedeg gan wirfoddolwyr sy'n cynhyrchu busnes i westai a sefydliadau gwely a brecwast yn yr ardal.

Bu pryder am lawer o flynyddoed gan sefydliadau chwaraeon modur, o'r fath fel bod y pryderon hyn wedi eu cyfeirio'n uniongyrchol at Edwina Hart, Gweinidog Economi, Gwyddoniaeth a Thrafnidiaeth. Gall trefnu digwyddiadau fod, ac maent yn mynd, yn hunllef i glybiau.

Mae'n hysbys hefyd bod y Gweinidog wedi ysgrifennu llythyrau deifiol at Gyngor Sir Powys fwy nag unwaith yn mynegi pryderon dwys y gallai agwedd y Cyngor achosi anfantais economaidd i Bowys ar fater pwysig iawn Twristiaeth.

Tra bod y pryderon hyn yn hysbys i bobl yn y maes Chwaraeon Modur, pryd y mae holl Gynghorwyr Sir Powys yn mynd i gael briffiad ar bryderon Edwina Hart, gan ei bod yn ymddangos bod Trwyddedau Adran 33 yn cael eu cyflwyno gan Gynghorau eraill gan yr Adran Briffyrdd, ond ym Mhowys, yr Adran Hawliau Tramwy sydd wedi bod yn gwneud hynny. Felly, beth sy'n mynd i gael ei wneud mewn perthynas â phryderon y Gweinidog i ddiogelu dyfodol Chwaraeon Modur a Thwristiaeth a lles busnesau ym Mhowys?

Mae'r Cabinet a'r Arweinydd wrth gwrs yn gefnogol iawn i chwaraeon modur a drefnir ym Mhowys.

Rwyf i, ac aelodau eraill y Cabinet wedi cyfarfod â'r trefnwyr ac wedi gweld arferion gorau yn ddiweddar. Wrth roddi awdurdod adran 33, byddwch wrth gwrs yn ymwybodol bod angen i'r Cyngor Sir sicrhau ei fod yn cydymffurfio â deddfwriaeth arall. Yn benodol, mae'n hanfodol bod y Cyngor yn sicrhau bod hawliau tramwy cyhoeddus yn cael eu gwarchod, i ddiogelu'r cyhoedd sy'n eu defnyddio a bod unrhyw niwed i'w arwynebau yn cael ei drwsio.
