#### 1. Summary

1.1 There is a new housing development being constructed off Ithon Road, Llandrindod Wells. As part of the planning conditions for the site, the developer must arrange for the speed limit on Ithon Road to be reduced from the current national speed limit to 40mph. This will act as a buffer zone between the national speed limit on the unnamed section of the A4081 and the 20mph speed limit in the proposed development. It will also act as a buffer between the national speed limit on the unnamed section and the 30mph speed limit on the southern end of Ithon Road. The costs of the advertisement and implementation of the proposed speed limit will be borne by the developer.

#### 2. Proposal

2.1 It is proposed to introduce a 40mph speed limit along part of Ithon Road. The length of the proposal is shown in the attached plan



- 1.1 Due to the increased popularity of walking in around Pontneddfechan and Ystradfellte there been a vast increase in inconsiderate parking. Through liaison with Brecon Beacons National Park officers, a few sites were identified as being particular areas of concern. Due to the high volume of visitors parking in inconsiderate locations, sections of carriageway are narrowed considerably, preventing the passage of many vehicles, in particular, emergency services vehicles.
- 1.2 BBNP have received funding to help alleviate parking issues and congestion in this area and have proposed to fund parking restrictions at the areas causing most concern.




