1. <u>Summary</u>

- 1.1 Full planning consent has been secured by WYRO to construct a residential development at Dolforgan View. Kerry. One of the developer's obligations with respect to this development is to fund a traffic order to modify the speed limit extents along the A489 on the approach to the development from the Newtown direction, and to construct their new estate roads as 20mph zone roads.
- 1.2 The area traffic engineer has discussed and agreed the extents of the speed limit modifications with the developer to serve their development, and it is proposed to utilise the opportunity to modify the speed limits at other locations within the village of Kerry too as a result of traffic speed concerns raised with the highway authority by the community council over the last few years. These additional speed limit modifications would comprise of a 40mph buffer zone before entering the existing 30mph speed limit along the A489 from the east, and the introduction of a 20mph zone to cover the existing residential access roads on the Dolforgan Park estate and the existing and new residential access roads on the Dolforgan View estate.
- 1.3 The developer has already paid the Council's fee to consult, advertise and bring into effect the traffic regulation order.
- 1.4 The developer will fund the major works to erect the signage and apply the appropriate carriageway markings for the 30mph extension, the western 40mph buffer zone and the 20mph zone signage for their new residential estate roads as part of their development works.
- 1.5 The minor works to erect the eastern 40mph buffer zone and the 20mph zone signage for the existing Dolforgan Park/View estate roads will be funded from the normal HGSS sign maintenance budget.

- 1.6 The existing speed limit extents along the affected roads within the village are identified on the plan attached to this report at Appendix A.
- 1.7 The proposed speed limit modification proposals are attached to this report at Appendix B.
- 1.8 The proposed speed limit extensions are compliant with the Welsh Assembly Government Circular No. 24/2009 "Setting Local Speed Limits in Wales", and the proposed speed limit modifications are supported by the police, the community council and the local county councillor.

2. <u>Proposal</u>

To introduce a permanent Traffic Regulation Order to modify the extent of the existing 30 mph speed limit along the A489 which runs through Kerry; to introduce a 40 mph speed limit buffer zone on both approaches to the 30 mph speed limit along the A489; and to introduce a 20 mph zone speed limit along the U4731 Dolforgan Park, the U4725 Dolforgan View and the proposed new adoptable residential estate roads on the WYRO development.
