SUBJECT: Welsh Language Promotion Strategy

REPORT FOR: Decision

1. Summary

The Welsh Language (Wales) Measure 2011, and the Welsh Language Standards place a statutory requirement on Powys County Council to provide services through the medium of Welsh, to consider the impact of its services and policies on the Welsh language, and to promote the use of the Welsh language within its area.

The Welsh Language Standards Compliance Notice was issued to the Council in September 2015, and agreed by Cabinet in January 2016. The Standards became operational on 30 March 2016.

Within the Compliance Notice, the Welsh Language Promotion Standards section includes a Standard to produce a Welsh Language Promotion Strategy, as follows;

Standard 145

You must produce, and publish on your website, a 5-year strategy that sets out how you propose to promote the Welsh language and to facilitate the use of the Welsh language more widely in your area; and the strategy must include (amongst other matters) –

(a) a target (in terms of the percentage of speakers in your area) for increasing or maintaining the number of Welsh speakers in your area by the end of the 5 year period concerned, and

(b) a statement setting out how you intend to reach that target; and you must review the strategy and publish a revised version on your website within 5 years of publishing a strategy (or of publishing a revised strategy).

Like many other Welsh local authority areas, Powys saw a reduction in the number and percentage of Welsh speakers, from 25,798 or 21.1% of the county's population in 2001, to 23,990 or 18.6% of the population according to the 2011 Census. This general picture is very similar to that for the whole of Wales, with a reduction from 20.8% in 2001 to 19% in 2011, and is consistent

with that experienced in other areas such as Ynys Môn, Conwy, Pembrokeshire and Neath Port Talbot.

The proposed Welsh Language Promotion Strategy set out in Appendix A outlines 6 key areas for action to promote the Welsh language, with each theme having actions to align them with the 3 strategic themes identified within the Welsh Government's Cymraeg 2050 strategy, to a) increase the number of Welsh speakers; b) increase the use of Welsh; and c) to create favourable conditions for the Welsh language to flourish.

The 6 key areas for action are as follows;

1. Planning and language policy
2. Normalisation
3. Education
4. People
5. Support
6. Rights

The target in this Strategy, and subsequent strategies will be to contribute towards the Welsh Government's target of ensuring a million Welsh speakers by 2050. To achieve that target, a third of Powys' population must speak Welsh by 2050.

The target for this Strategy will be to restore the percentage of Welsh speakers in Powys to at least that of the 2001 Census, which was 21.1%.
