



# Corporate Plan Engagement – Summary Findings Report

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## What are we doing?

Following the election in May, the Council needs to produce a new Corporate and Strategic Equality Plan to help the residents of Powys achieve their well-being goals. To achieve our vision, we have set the objectives below that are the core aims of the plan:

- We will improve people’s awareness of services, and how to access them, so that they can make informed choices.
- We will provide good quality, sustainable employment, and training opportunities, whilst pursuing real living wage employer accreditation.
- We will work to tackle poverty and inequality to support the well-being of the people of Powys.

## Why are we doing it?

The overall aim is to use the feedback received to determine how well the new objectives have been received by the people of Powys and what may need to be changed so that we can ensure that there is a Corporate Plan that delivers for the people of Powys.

## When did it happen?

The Corporate Plan Survey and Padlet board ran from Monday 28 November to Friday 23 December 2022.

## How many people were involved?

In total, we had 614 responses during the engagement period, including:

- 452 survey responses
- 149 Padlet posts
- 8 social media comments
- 5 emails to haveyoursay@powys.gov.uk

## Survey Responses

Any reference to names/addresses have been removed to comply with data protection. Any responses containing profanity and abusive language included in the open comments have been removed.*

## Recommendations

Analysis from the feedback provided has highlighted five key recommendations for Cabinet to consider, which if agreed, will be incorporated within the Corporate Plan:

R1	Strengthening the work being undertaking to support the Welsh Language, drawing links to workstreams such as the Welsh Language Promotion Strategy
R2	Including access to arts and cultural assets to be addressed more prominently within objective 1, “We will improve people’s awareness of services, and how to access them, so that they can make informed choices”
R3	To further demonstrate the links between job creation and economic development within the Plan, and further strengthening objective 2, “We will provide good quality, sustainable employment, and training opportunities, whilst pursuing real living wage employer accreditation” to reflect this
R4	Many responses did not understand the roles and responsibilities of the Council and it’s wider Partnership plans, which could be supported by a section detailing the most prominent partnerships, include the Public Service Board, Regional Partnership Board and Corporate Joint Committee

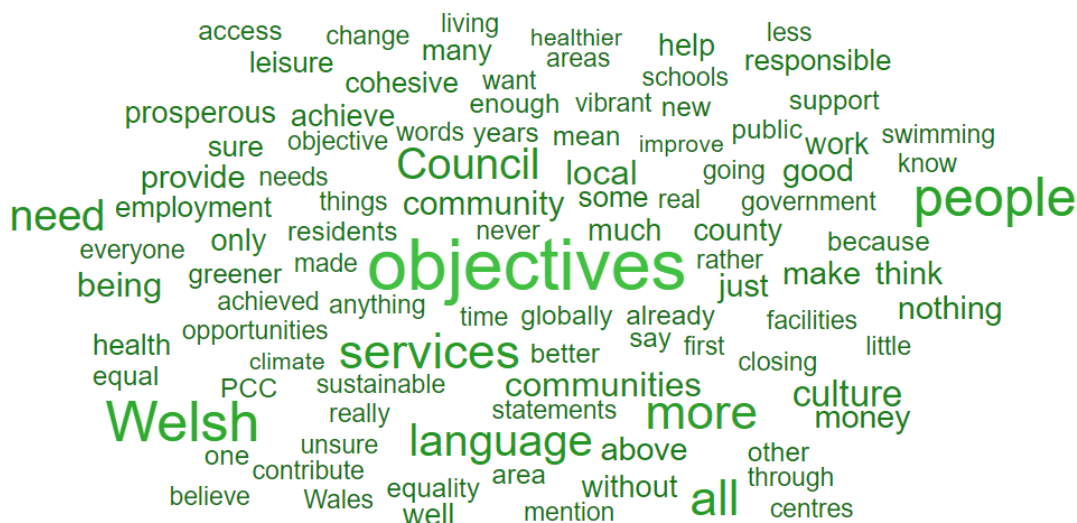

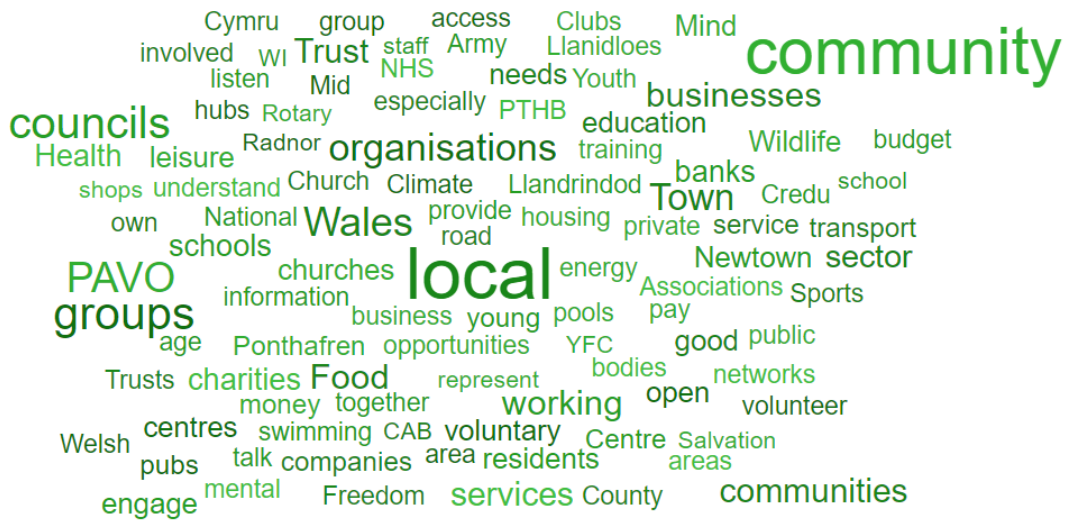

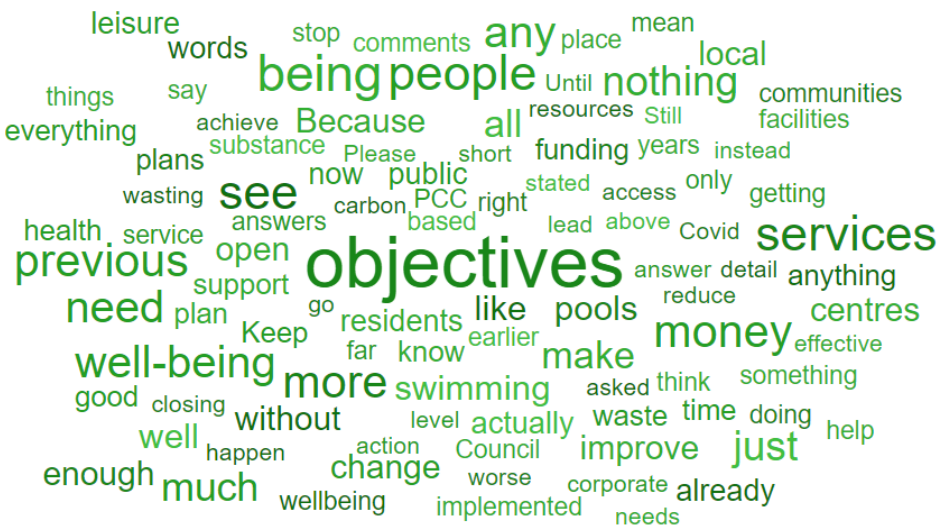

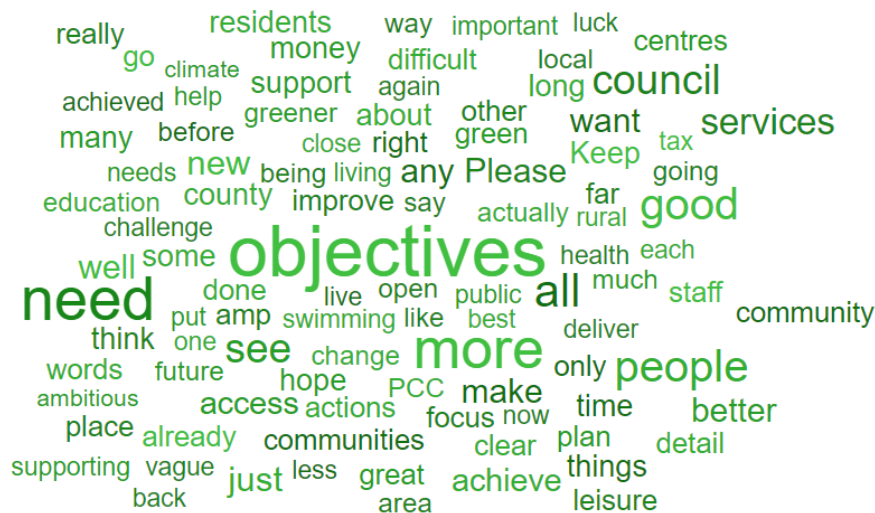

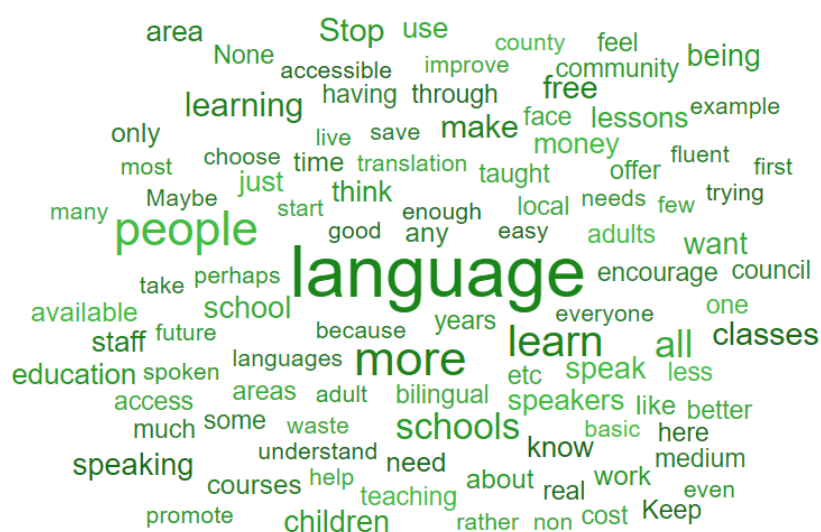
This question had 28 responses, including four comments asking if this survey was available in Welsh. The survey and all associated (internal and external) communications were produced and promoted bilingually. Other responses included:

- We don't give the Welsh language equal status. It's a sad fact we live in an area where English is the predominate language and whilst I would love to see the Welsh language thrive in the workplace, that's many years away.
- Local schools becoming purely Welsh language only is discriminant and does not reflect local demographic
- Not directly the council, but signs in doctors' surgeries and local hospitals should be improved.
- ATMs should be in both languages, the ones in supermarkets are not.
- There are not enough free ways to learn Welsh or communicated benefits of investing in it. Not enough role models, not enough of a sense of identity or sense of social responsibility or history / cultural roots to drive an interest in Welsh.
- There are not enough Welsh schools in the county.
